"Abide in me means to continue in a daily, personal relationship with Jesus, characterized by trust, prayer, obedience, and joy" (ESV Study Bible pg. 2054).

"We turn each truth that we **learn about God** into matter for **meditation before God**, leading to **prayer and praise to God** . . . Meditation is the activity of calling to mind, and thinking over, and dwelling on, and applying to oneself, the various things that one knows about the works and ways and purposes and promises of God. It is an activity of holy thought, consciously performed in the presence of God, under the eye of God, by the help of God, <u>as a means of communion</u> <u>with God</u>" (J.I. Packer, *Knowing God* pg.23).

2. A Fervent Prayer Life.

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"So in moments of discipline we get loaded for bear; we get cranked up emotionally and think if we are stern enough and loud enough, and make threats that are big enough, we will win, and our children will instantly change" (Paul Tripp, *Parenting* pg. 85).
